# A New AVA/ELEMENT3 Health Walk Voucher Program Update

Thank you and congratulations to all members who have already signed up

for the new Walk Voucher Program with Element3 Health. By now you should have completed your activity survey questionnaire for events completed in 2021. The next step is to create an AVA member account on my.ava.org so you can receive your free health walk vouchers!

Below is the process that eligible program members will follow to receive their free walk vouchers:
Each qualifying participant will receive an email from AVA informing them how many vouchers they will receive, when they will be available, and whether they qualified for a one year complimentary AVA Membership.
All qualifying participants must have a "myava.org" account in order to receive your vouchers.

For each voucher awarded, AVA will place a \$3 credit into you Online Start box (OSB) account. These vouchers can be used for any OSB Event.

As members redeem their vouchers on the Online Start box (OSB) the club will be report this participation on their quarterly report and will receive a credit for \$1.75 for the redeemed voucher.

#### **Tales from the Trails**

Louisiana, Part 1 - Thursday, January 13, 2022 – Taken from Susan Alton's Travel Bug Blog These are the first two walks of eight Louisiana Parish walks this weekend. There is also a traditional walking event at Clark Creek Natural Area in Woodville, Mississippi, on Monday morning.

The walk this morning in Covington, Louisiana, started at 8:30 am. It was supposed to be fifteen minutes from our hotel in Mandeville ten miles away. We certainly didn't expect the traffic jam in Covington at 8:10 am. It took us 1/2 hour to get to the walk start exactly at 8:30 am.



The walk started at the Tammany Trace Trailhead, part of the Rails-to-Trails Conservancy (this trail is 28.2 miles). The trailhead was at a small park with restrooms and more than enough parking for our group.

The park had a few points of interest: an old water tower, a statue of Ronald Reagan, and a nice gazebo that was decorated for Mardi Gras. While Susan Medlin was signing in for the walk, I roamed the park and took photos.

The 29-mile-long Bogue Falaya River flows into the 34-mile-long Tchefuncte River, one of the greatest contributing rivers of the Lake Pontchartrain basin in southeastern Louisiana. Together, the

rivers drain a 192.26-square-mile watershed that drains upland pine savannahs and large wetland floodplains.

It was like a starting shot went off and a group of Volksmarchers headed out on the path. Some stayed together for the whole walk, and others split up into smaller groups. Spoiler alert: We all ended up in the same place: the cemetery. LOL.

It was a beautiful walking day. Not a cloud in the sky and a pleasant temperature to boot. After the cemetery, we passed by the St. Tammany Parish Justice Center and continued for eight blocks through neighborhoods.



St. Paul's School was our next point of interest. St. Paul's School is a private, all-boys Lasillian high school located in Covington, Louisiana. The school is run by the Christian Brothers and is one of the 1,000 Lasillian schools in more than 80 countries. If you want to know what Lasillian schools are, click this link.

Neighborhoods came next, along with a pretty park. After the Episcopal Church, we turned down Park St. to get to Bogue Falaya Wayside Park. What a lovely stroll we had along the walking path through the park.

Once out of the park, we entered a cute, eclectic neighborhood (Boston St., Rutland, and Lee Lane) with antique shops, quaint accommodations, and a British Tea Room.

We finished the first 10k walk and burned off a lot of calories. Walkers like to eat and socialize. I heard a partial conversation before we started walking that people were going to have dinner at The Rusty Pelican and it was two blocks from our walk starting point. We thought since it was close, we would go there for lunch. This Covington Rusty Pelican was actually more than two blocks from our starting point. Did we drive the long way 'round?

You know a restaurant is good when the sheriffs and firemen eat there. Three fire trucks, an ambulance, and a couple of sheriffs showed up. Unfortunately, there was a fire call and two fire trucks pulled out just after they placed their order. One 10k walk down for today. To be continued in Part 2.

## Part 2 - Thursday, January 13, 2022

After lunch at Covington's Rusty Pelican restaurant, we drove approximately ten minutes to the start location for our Mandeville, Louisiana, 10k walk. We only had to travel four miles on I-10 east through a construction zone. Our walk in Mandeville started at the Tammany Trace Trailhead on Girod St. We didn't actually go on the trail here, but turned onto Girod St. heading for Lake Pontchartrain.



From the start of this walk, I was charmed by the cute houses, many of them decorated for Mardi Gras. There were businesses along Girod Street, including another Rusty Pelican restaurant a couple of blocks from the trailhead. This is the location where the group is going for dinner tonight, not Covington.

The weather today was gorgeous. It was 65 degrees with a 9 mph breeze coming off the lake. It was a little chilly, but once we headed away from the lake, out of the wind, we took our coats off.

Gorgeous homes lined the road along Lake Pontchartrain.

Lake Pontchartrain began forming about 5,000 years ago when North American glacier melts caused the Mississippi River to swell and shift to the east. The river began depositing sediments into the Gulf of Mexico. creating a broad delta that would eventually become the Orleans, St. Bernard, and Plaquemines Parishes.

The city of Mandeville has quite a history. Bob and I learned a lot about it when we camped at Fontainebleau State Park a few years ago. The city was developed in 1834 by Bernard Xavier de Marigny de Mandeville, who came from a prominent and wealthy family. Even though he resided in New Orleans, he maintained a large and profitable sugar plantation located on the present site of Fontainebleau State Park. Mandeville was developed early on as a lakeside summer retreat for the wealthy citizens of the Crescent City (New Orleans). That is why there are many beautiful and unique homes along the lake shore.
