14 October 2023 there will be an annular eclipse. This is a Saturday and the San Antonio Pathfinders will host a new traditional walk that day starting at

10 a.m. The eclipse on 14 October 2023 is called an annular eclipse because the moon will not totally cover the sun like in a total eclipse. The moon will be farther away from the earth which will make it look smaller in the sky allowing a ring of light from the sun to shine through. This is called a "ring of fire" which makes it an annular eclipse not a total eclipse which is going to happen on 8 April 2024.

An interesting fact to note is a total eclipse takes an average of 375 years to happen again in the same location. Join the San Pathfinders on 14 October for a traditional event that will take place during the Annular Eclipse. Approved solar filtered glasses will be available at this event.

Mark your calendars for the Solar Eclipse:

On 8 April, there will be a total eclipse. The Roadrunners will host a traditional walk this day. There will be information on the Roadrunner web site regarding both of these events to include a national walk week schedule (1 - 7 April), with hotel information, etc.

Both of these eclipses will require the special glasses. I have these for sale for \$3 a pair until the supply runs out and I bring glasses to each RR walk. *Ellen*

Want to visit San Antonio? Readers rave about city while sharing tips on sites, food, fun.

Greg Sells travels to San Antonio frequently to pursue his hobby of "volksmarching," a form of noncompetitive fitness walking. The American Volkssport Association is headquartered in the Southtown neighborhood.

"Many volksmarchers discovered the activity when stationed with the military in Germany, which brings us to another foundation of San Antonio's economy," Sells writes. "San Antonio has proclaimed itself 'Military City USA,' although it now boasts three bases rather than five — technically now one, Joint Base San Antonio, which encompasses Fort Sam Houston with Lackland and Randolph Air Force Bases. The two closed bases are Kelly and Brooks, both undergoing redevelopment. Another landmark of military heritage is the Arsenal south of downtown, now the H-E-B headquarters."

Tales from the Trails -Queen Elizabeth Park 10 km Volksmarch in Vancouver, British Columbia! - Wednesday, September 20, 2023 - taken from Susan Alton's Travelbug blog. On Wednesday, September 20, we decided to do a 10 km Volksmarch in the Kensington neighborhood to Queen Elizabeth Park.

The start box for our walk was in a bookstore in downtown Vancouver. I went into the bookstore to register and pick up the instructions to our starting point in the Shaughnessy area of Vancouver, B.C.

It is hard getting around a huge city when you're not familiar with the roads. Thank goodness for Garmin! She routed us to the community center where there was a large, free parking lot. After using the washrooms, we started walking.

It's fun to see the personality of neighborhoods. There was art high up on wires in the trees at one intersection with a bike path.



We entered Queen Elizabeth Park at the Little Mountain Disc Golf Course where a group of young men were playing disc golf. There are lots of things to do in Queen Elizabeth Park! We continued up a hill to the Rose Garden. A surprising number of roses were still in bloom.

From the rose garden, we made our way to the Queen Elizabeth Plaza. The Bloedel Floral Conservancy is in the dome-shaped building. We did not go in. I've heard it is loaded with tropical plants and birds.



Exploration was the name of the game in this part of the park. Our eyes were immediately drawn to the North Shore mountains of downtown Vancouver. What a day! While on the plaza, we could walk to the far left for a view of the Large Quarry Garden.



We walked to the far right of the plaza, and had fun taking photos with the "Photo Session" statues, by Seward Johnson.

We took a detour up some steps to see "Love in the Rain," a sculpture built for the purpose of attaching "Love Locks." Love Locks have become a problem around the world when people attach them to bridges. This is a new idea to give people somewhere to put their love locks other than city infrastructures. From the statues, we could look down into the Small Quarry Garden, AKA the Anniversary Garden. In 1993, at Seasons in the Park Restaurant. President Bill Clinton and President Boris Yeltsin (Russian Federation) dined there.

We headed out of Queen Elizabeth Park and walked past some funky-looking sculptures. I found that these sculptures are the artist's depiction of ravens. The artists are the Manitoba Aboriginal Arts Council, Inc. The sponsor donor was the Aboriginal Art Program for the 2010 Olympic Winter Games. We continued on past the Nat Bailey Stadium, "The Nat" for short. Here is where the Vancouver Canadians play baseball. This is known as Rogers Field

On the way back to the car, we walked through the Mountain View Cemetery.

Next we are planning to do a group walk with the Vancouver Venturers Volkssport Club in the Kitsilano/West Point Grey area to Pacific Spirit Regional Park, Jericho Beach Park, Spanish Banks, and Locarno Beach.
