AVA Vice Chair - Carl Cordes International Walking Opportunity March 2024

Who's ready to walk in New Zealand and Australia? A unique set of circumstances will allow you to travel down under for three separate events in 10 days. Two International Marching League events will be held on consecutive weekends in March. The Rotorua Walking Festival, New Zealand, is March 15-17, 2024. IML and IVV credit distances include 10, 20, 30 and 42K. March 22-24 is the Aussie Peace Walk in Canberra, Australia. Distances for IML and IVV credit include 11, 12, 21,24 and 42K. Also happening in Canberra prior to the Aussie Peace Walk is the IVV Congress of Delegates Assembly March 19-21. This will be my first time attending the IVV Congress of Delegates.

I'm working with P.T.A. Tours to arrange a travel program for myself and others that may wish to go from the U.S. Price will depend on the number of participants. There can also be several options to continue your visit in Australia after the Aussie Peace Walk. Susan A. Medlin Southwest Regional Director Trip To Finland

I am organizing a trip to Finland in August, 2025 for the Finland IML (August 8-10) and the next IVV Olympiad (August 14-17). The tour company is PTA and it will be an English speaking tour. My POC is Andrea Baumeisner. She and Thomas are going on a 14-day inspection to Sweden and Finland in August to work on the details for this trip. So far, we start the tour in Sweden with an IVV walk in Stockholm, and visit Stockholm. Then we drive north along the coast, stopping at a UNESCO World Heritage Site for another IVV walk.

Next, we take the ferry to Vaasa, Finland for the 2-day IML walking event in Vaasa. After the IML, we head to the south coast to Turku. There we combine cruising and walking at the Archipelagoes around Turku. Then we continue to Tampere for the 4-day 2025 IVV Olympiad Walking Event in Tampere. Finish with a drive to Helsinki, and tour of Helsinki. The regular tour ends there and you fly home from Helsinki. There will be an add on package; a post Olympiad tour to the 3 Baltic states. Spend 2 days in Tallinn, Estonia; 2 days in Riga, Latvia; and 2 days in Vilnius, Lithuania.

Tales from the Trails – Tribute to Freedom Walk Event, Oct. 14–submitted by Susan Alton

On Saturday, October 14, Bob and I did the Tribute to Freedom Volksmarch which included the annular eclipse. The walk started at 10:00 a.m. to allow us to walk during the eclipse. It was cloudy and a cold wind was blowing this morning. Heavy cloud cover begged the question, "Will we be able to see the eclipse?" This is a brand new walk for our area so, eclipse or not, we will be seeing new sights.

The walk started at New Life Christian Church Center outside Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas.

Our first point of interest was the Galilee Prayer Garden. The different sections of the church's outdoor exhibits include a pond, a replica of the Western Wall in Israel, Biblical quotes throughout the garden, and the San Antonio 9/11 Memorial Garden with its Eternal Flame.



Western Wall

As we walked, I wondered "What is the difference between the Western Wall and the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem?" According to www.TouristIsrael.com, the Western Wall, also known as "The Wailing Wall" or the "Kotel," is the most religious site in the world for the Jewish people. Located in the Old City in Jerusalem, its significance lies in the fact that it is the last remnant of the original retaining wall that surrounded the Second Temple, built over 2,000 years ago, and an incredibly important site of modern Israeli history.

From the Galilee Prayer Garden, we crossed a road to get to the San Antonio 9/11 Memorial and its Eternal Flame. We continued around the 9/11 Memorial Wall to Leon Creek New Life Trailhead. At this point, we followed the outer fence of Lackland Air Force Base. Signs on the fence warned of trained guard dogs inside the fence.



Tribute to Freedom

Artist George Schroeder of San Antonio who designed the "Tribute to Freedom" sculpture says it includes forms representing the five branches of the U.S. military surrounding a 75-foot tower. The central spire reminds us of the Washington Monument. Around the central spire, an airfoil-like wing and three curvilinear forms create a "protective shroud" around the symbol of the nation's capital. At night, white light illuminates the sculpture from Saturday to Thursday. Blue light on Friday nights commemorates the weekly basic

training graduation of new Air Force Airmen. We learn so many interesting things on our walks!

We returned to the trail junction by the 9/11 Memorial and turned east to follow another branch of the Leon Creek Greenway Trail. In a quarter mile, we could see the fuselage of a C-130 Hercules Air Force plane behind a fence. This was the 5 km turn-around point.

The 10 km walk passed underneath U.S. 90 and continued on the Leon Creek Trail. At the junction pictured below, we turned right, crossed a creek, and continued two stories up a set of stairs. At the top of the stairs, we entered Levi Strauss Park and went past soccer fields to the Nelson W. Wolff Trailhead. This is where Camargo Park's minor league baseball field is located.



We went down the stairs we had gone up and continued to Rodriguez Park. The trail went under the Old Highway 90 Bridge. We walked the length of the parking lot and then returned back through the park on the Leon Creek Greenway Trail.

A quarter-mile later, we stopped on the trail so we could watch the final minutes up to the 90% annular eclipse. The clouds parted and we had a great view. The 90% annular eclipse "Ring of Fire" was terrific.

Thank you to Kathy and Mike Schwencke of the San Antonio Pathfinders AVA Club for such an interesting walk. We had 117 walkers today to see the eclipse!

The West Texas Trail Walkers are returning to Ruidoso and the

beautiful Lincoln Mountains in New Mexico. The dates are October 11-13, 2024. Stay tuned for more information in the spring of 2024.

We had a wonderful hiking weekend at Palo Duro Canyon State Park, Canyon, Texas two weeks ago with 83 participants. The weather was almost perfect. Clear blue skies contrasted beautifully with the red rock ridges and the vivid green vegetation along the creeks.
