Tales from the Trails

Mid-November may not be the optimal season for visiting Maine, but business takes me there annually at that time, and this year my 'Aggie' daughter, Mary Beth, accompanied me, thanks to a frequent flyer ticket (on my part) and some use-or-lose vacation (on her part). She had never been to New England and was anxious to see some of it. Somewhat of a fitness buff, and anxious to fit into a wedding dress next fall, she was more than ready for a Volksmarch after several meals of lobster, clams, and Maine microbrews.

Volksmarching in Maine is problematic during the colder months. Most of Maine's walks are seasonal events and our choices were thus limited.

Nonetheless, with clear blue skies and fantastic weather by Maine standards (albeit with temperatures in the 40's, it was a little chilly for us 'soft' Texans), we were determined to walk off our lemon butter and chowder and managed to find a couple of walks that proved to be spectacular.

The first was the Capital Walk in Augusta. After leaving the start point and crossing the Kennebec River, we circled the Maine State House and continued through Augusta's quaint riverside downtown. We then crossed back over the river to tour Fort Western, the oldest surviving fort in New England, dating to 1754. From there, we traversed the grounds of the Army's old Kennebec Arsenal before returning to the start point. In addition to spectacular scenery, the walk provides for several tough-to-secure special program stamps; on last-year's visit to Maine, I had collected the State Capital stamp, as well as my final 'Liberty Bell' and 'Forts' stamps.

A few days later, we found ourselves in Portland where another beautiful bluesky day allowed us to tackle one of my all-time favorite walks, the South Portland Lighthouse walk. For you lighthouse buffs, it doesn't get any better than this. The walk heads out to what is, perhaps, one of the most impressive lights in a State that has a multitude of them. But the Portland Head Light, located on the grounds of Fort Williams, is but one of three that the Volksmarcher will encounter on this walk, the others being the 'Bug' Light and the Portland Breakwater Light. As if that weren't enough, one can view a couple of additional lighthouses on islands out in Casco Bay as they walk


along the beach. The spectacular beach walk culminates at another impressive stone bastion, Fort Preble, a War-of-1812- era structure now housing parts of Southern Maine Community College. The fort also played a role in the Civil War defense of Portland and the South Portland walk will thus qualify for Civil War Battlefield program credit in 2013.

The next morning it was time to head back to San Antonio. Despite a 6:00 am flight, I managed to get 'the Aggie' up semi-enthusiastically at 3:30 in order to have one more lobster omelet at Becky's Diner prior to departing. Becky's is a Portland waterfront icon and opens at 4:00 am, catering to the lobstermen. It was the perfect ending to a pleasant little getaway.

AVA Website Re-design: What Changed? The AVA has a new redesigned official website just launched December 18. Before you start to explore, take a moment to read the following brief synopsis of some of the more significant revisions. Please submit any comments to avawebmaster@ava.org and tell a friend about the site.

We have created more user friendly and faster navigation schemes to help streamline communications and to enhance and simplify your overall online experience. As part of this, we added a Google search link to retrieve specific subject matter from anywhere on the site.

The homepage features a customized photo slideshow. Easy access links to revenue producing programs such as membership, donations and sponsorship have been prominently displayed and grouped together on the homepage. The donations page was created to provide an alternative for companies unable to support a major sponsorship with AVA, to donate a lesser but still substantial amount. And individuals who wish to donate more than the current membership amounts can do so. Two new updated fact sheets and a second walking video have been included under the About Us link. Other materials for this link are currently being developed.

Duplicate and unnecessary information listings have been eliminated. Subject matter areas have been reorganized and some major links consolidated. The existing links from the old site have been consolidated from 19 to 11.

In keeping with social media demands, individuals can now access the AVA website through their smart phones or tablets using multiple browsers. We installed an AVA Facebook page link on the homepage. However, you need a personal Facebook account to access it. Click the blue "F" button and follow the Facebook sign up instructions. Another new feature is a blog with direct postings to the AVA Facebook page. A feasibility study will be conducted regarding use of Twitter.

The listing of Associate and Lifetime individual membership benefits has been clarified, and new benefits have been added, with more on the way. Administratively, selected forms are being made interactive so you can enter requested information and email them, thus eliminating the fax or postal mail process. This process is ongoing.

We have incorporated Google Analytics software to determine the number of individuals visiting our site, where they visited and for how long. This is important information for potential
