Medal Mania at the AVA!


For the last year or so I have been trying to make sense of the many boxes and bags of donated Volkssport medals that had a home in Hector's office.

ANNUAL SPRING VOLKSMARCH - JUNE 4 AND JUNE 5, 2022

The Crazy Horse Volksmarch is the most popular organized hike in the United States (15,000 walkers in a record year).

This family event is sponsored by the Black Hills Chapter of the American Volkssport Association (AVA) and hosted by Crazy Horse Memorial®.

The bi-annual Crazy Horse Volksmarch (an organized hike) is a 10K or 6.2-mile woodlands ramble to the world's largest mountain carving in progress in the southern Black Hills of South Dakota.

National Walking Week – Wednesday, April 6, 2022

The American Heart Association's <u>National Walking Day</u> is every year on the first Wednesday in April. It was established in 2007 to promote a healthy lifestyle and get people moving.

AVA: America's Walking Club wanted to encourage people to get out and walk more. In 2020, they built National Walking Week, April 1-7, around

National Walking Day. This was on Day 6 of National Walking Week.

The Texas Trail Roundup Club sponsored Wednesday's Downtown San Antonio Churches Walk. I started walking at 10 am. It was WINDY! So, I wore a windbreaker for the first four miles of the 10k walk.

One thing is certain about walking in downtown San Antonio, there's a lot of ongoing construction of buildings, streets, and sidewalks.

Walking down our first block, we came to the Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church.



After we walked around Urban Loop where this church was located, we got onto Cesar Chavez Blvd. which is very torn up. Construction was in full swing with equipment sometimes coming onto the sidewalk.

One of our huge festivals, *Fiesta!*, was going on. There are events all over the city for about two weeks.

A few blocks later, we turned off Cesar Chavez Blvd. to go to Market Square. If you want great food or a well-stocked bakery early in the day, you could go to Mi Tierra. This is a huge, well-loved restaurant at Market Square.

From Market Square, we walked through Milam Park next to the Children's Hospital of San Antonio. Milam Park has a statue of Benjamin Milam, a gazebo, a playground, and tables with checker/chess boards painted on them.

In a few blocks, we came to our next church, San Francesco di Paola Catholic Church. This Romanesque building with decorative stone detailing, roundarched stained glass windows, and spire was dedicated on May 1, 1927.



Next to the church is the Christopher Columbus Italian Society Hall. It was built to complement the church next door..

Behind the church is San Pedro Creek Cultural Park. The birds love this oasis downtown as you will see. A brand new section is being added to this downtown park.


I caught up with Scott and Paulette and walked with them for a while. Crisscrossing downtown San Antonio, we passed the Southwest School of Arts, the Central Branch of the Public Library whose color has been described as "enchilada sauce," murals, the Tobin Center for the Performing Arts, the old AT&T Building, and the Veterans Memorial Plaza. There is so much to see downtown!

The walk route took us past St. Mark's Episcopal Church, First Church of Christ Scientist, Grace Lutheran Church, Scottish Rite Cathedral, St. Joseph's Catholic Church and the Alamo.



We walked on to La Villita is where NIOSA (Night in Old San Antonio) takes place. Food, drink, cascarone, and souvenir booths line the streets of La Villita, San Antonio's first neighborhood. During the festival, this place is a total zoo. If you love being in massive crowds of people so thick you can't move, then this festival is for you.

Leaving La Villita, we headed back to the downtown core. We passed the Buckhorn Museum and St. Mary's Catholic Church on our way to the finish.

Walk New Mexico Program
Starting in 2022, a new 'Walk New
Mexico' program will be working in the
33 counties in the state. New Mexico
already has YREs in 9 counties.

The Sun Country Striders have added several more seasonal walks and 4 new YREs which will allow you to cover the entire southeast section of the state in 2022. The 4 new county YREs are Lovington in Lea County, Portales in Roosevelt County, Clovis in Curry County, and Fort Sumner in De Baca County.

Also, the Woodland Wanderers from Colorado have started a 'Charley Pride' challenge to do walks from Phoenix, AZ to San Antonio, TX and have added 3 walks in New Mexico. These include Lordsburg in Hidalgo County, San Antonio (NM) in Socorro County, and Roswell. These walks are available from Apr 10 thru the end of the year, except for Roswell which is not available until May 3. Contact Helen Hull (HelenTheHun@yahoo.com) for your New Mexico logbook and patch and start exploring the Land of Enchantment or Ruidoso.
